Where Are They Now





In early January 2019 it will be 40 years ago that I joined IBM in Boca Raton. I joined IBM in January 1979 after receiving a BS degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Kentucky, and I have many fond memories from my early IBM career, remembering many talented people that I had the privilege to work with and learn from. As a System Development Engineer and Logic Designer I worked on notable projects such as the System 23 Datamaster File Server, PC jr, PS/2, PS/2 Model 80, PS/2 Model 70/A21, and PS/2 Model 90/95. Also during my years in Florida, I was given the opportunity, and took a 2 year temporary overseas assignment with IBM in Yamato, Japan, from January, 1990, to December, 1991. In Japan, I worked on system design and architecture for IBM Portables, including the P75 luggable, N51 SLC/SX notebook, and CL57SX color laptop. After returning to Boca Raton in January 1992, I became the lead architect responsible for the definition of PCI systems and chipsets at a joint IBM/Intel alliance team known as the Novce Development Center.

After working on many exciting Intel based PC products during my 15 years in Boca, I transferred to IBM Austin in February 1994. While in Austin, I was a member of the product team that worked on developing PowerPC processor based entry SMP workstations and low end client PCs running AIX and Windows/NT. I was the lead system engineer for the RS/6000 43P and the 43P/240, and worked in Austin for 3+ years, from February 1994 through June 1997.

In mid 1997 I transferred to IBM Raleigh at Research Triangle Park, and worked there for the remainder of my IBM career, which in total was 34 years, 11 months, and 22 days, retiring at the end of December, 2013. I was appointed as an IBM Distinguished Engineer in April 2005, and during the 16 year span of my IBM career in RTP, I had various assignments working on High End Intel based Industry Standard Servers as Chief Engineer and Architect for 5 generations of IBM Enterprise X-Architecture, IBM BladeCenter Compute Blades, and IBM Flex System. Over my IBM career I was issued 35 patents ranging in areas of IO bus bridging, systems power management, memory subsystem design, and fault tolerant system design.

Since retiring at the end of 2013, I've been spending time on a woodworking hobby, occasionally volunteering with Habitat for Humanity, spending time with my 3 kids and 5 grandchildren, and traveling with my wife, Noi. Noi spends a lot of time with a quilting and sewing hobby, and she's received honors at various Quilting Symposiums and the yearly NC State Fair competition. My interest in woodworking began in 1980 while working at IBM and taking night classes several times a week at a Ft. Lauderdale High School. For about one and a half years, Noi and I made several pieces of furniture while attending the woodworking class and most importantly we learned how to use many different woodworking tools and began acquiring tools for our garage shop. The woodworking photo collage shows some of the projects that I've done for family, and were at various stages of completion when the photos were taken.
